The hotel comprises of 210 guestrooms, including 3 signature rooftop suites with its own private terrace overlooking the city. The Boardroom,

In order to demonstrate continual improvement in environmental and social sustainability, our commitment extends to energy efficiency, water conservation, reduction of waste and single-use plastic, solid waste management, community involvement, training and education, support of local employment, and minimizing our carbon footprint; present in The Hari sustainability action plan, each measured against the annual

Benchmarking Assessment of EarthCheck.
